I thought for sure the tow truck behind us (a large flatbed truck with a load on it) was going to ram the back of our van. But praise God, the driver saw us at the last minute, hit his brakes, and headed for the shoulder. He stopped with his cab parallel to our van, and didn't hit us.

We've experienced many other similar instances over the years, where we avoided a crash by nothing short of the grace of God. We do not take this for granted. Nearly every time we get into a vehicle to travel, one of us will either pray, or we'll ask one of the children to pray for our safety. And we know we aren't the only ones praying for traveling mercies. We thank all of you who faithfully pray for the safety of our family as we're on the road. God hears those prayers, and we benefit from them.

We're currently back in the Pacific Northwest, where we'll be staying for the rest of this month. Our travels will take us to Oregon and Idaho in the coming weeks, before we start heading towards Missouri again in early June. We'd appreciate continued prayers for our safety.

While on the road, Bryan logged into the Missouri Department of Resources website and confirmed that he passed both the water distribution and water treatment exams he took last month, thus making him a certified operator in Missouri. Praise God! Missionary Acres has needed a second qualified person on staff for many years.

Bryan has already been able to put the new knowledge he learned in the water classes to good use. For example, right before we left Missouri, during one of the daily chlorine samples taken, Manager Ken Moon noticed that the residual amount was too low. Some troubleshooting ensued, and Bryan was able to correctly diagnose and repair the problem with the chemical pump and get the system back up and running in about an hour. We praise God that repairs could be made quickly, the system did not have to be taken offline, and the water supply to the residents was not interrupted.

While traveling, we have had the opportunity to present the ministry of Missionary Acres in a couple of new churches. The entire family was also able to sit down and get better acquainted with a pastor of a church that some of our friends have been attending for years. Please pray that there will be continued opportunities to meet new churches and build relationships as we travel.

We have heard it said many times that Missionary Acres is the "best kept secret." We desire to share this ministry with as many people as God allows and no longer have it be a "secret".
