Please continue to pray for the current remodeling project. The family who will eventually move into that house has been living in temporary housing for over a year and a half. We are also working on the lot 65 new construction build that was started in September of 2020. Thanks in large part to the hard work of those who came to Missionary Acres this year, that house does have all the interior walls, most of the electrical rough in, and wastewater lines installed. There is still a lot of work need inside and around the house prior to the residents moving to Missionary Acres. The leadership has set a goal of completing both the lot 29 remodel project and the lot 65 new construction project in 2024.

Once these two projects are complete, we have seven additional empty homes that need assessed and repairs completed – possibly remodeling too – prior to taking new applications, and eventually placing families into these homes. We will continue to rely on your help and the help of others to complete these monumental tasks.

Thank you for your continued prayers for our family. It's been a challenging season, with Owen's health problems and we are so thankful to know that so many people are praying.

Unfortunately, there's not much of an update on Owen. The insurance won't approve the recommended medication until he turns 18 next year, and now some of his specialists are questioning the Pseudobulbar Affect diagnosis. We've got a couple of additional appointments scheduled between now and early next spring, and we trust that God has this all figured out – even though we don't. We can't imagine going through these challenges without His comfort and are very thankful for His goodness to us.

We're also thankful for time with family, especially this time of year. Most of us are heading across the state today to pick up Jayme from college. She gets to spend a week with us. We're going to take a quick ministry trip to Union City, Tennessee and then celebrate Thanksgiving here at the Acres.

The other kids are doing well. Sally is walking more often and enjoys trying to keep up with all of her siblings. Ezra is continuing to add to his vocabulary. And all of them sure like spending time on the swing set. The beautiful fall weather has been a joy – and we're thankful for all of the memories we're making together.
