Tanner Family Update

Owen recently had a follow-up appointment with his gastroenterology specialist. We are grateful that he is continuing to gain weight following his septic shock incident last year. The physician assisted us in replacing Owen's gastrostomy tube, and due to the positive report, we will now only need to see this specialist annually.

Owen also visited the movement clinic in St. Louis a few weeks ago. During his visit, a repeat x-ray of his hips was performed. Unfortunately, the x-rays revealed femoral anteversion, indicating that his thigh bone is rotated inward. Although it is not a severe case, if his walking gait continues to deteriorate, we may need to consult with the orthopedic team to discuss potential treatment options.

Jayme's college graduation is approaching soon. We will be attending her senior exhibition at the campus at the end of this month, followed by her graduation ceremony in early May. She will start her summer job at the nearby summer camp the Monday following graduation. It will be a blessing to see her more frequently, as she will be home on the weekends throughout the summer. It'll be a joy to attend church together!

The kids are working hard to complete their homeschool requirements for the year. They are eagerly anticipating summer break, although a few will continue with math and reading during the summer months to ensure they don't forget the skills they learned this year.
