As we approach the Thanksgiving holiday, our hearts are overflowing with gratitude for each one of you. Without our dedicated prayer warriors and generous financial partners, we couldn't be here at Missionary Acres.

In the words of one of our family's favorite hymns "Count Your Blessings," when we pause to "name them one by one," you all rise near the top of our list. Your unwavering support allows us to continue serving God's servants, and we thank God daily for placing you in our lives.

This month, we also have a special prayer request for our family. Our son Owen, who has Angelman Syndrome, is currently on the waiting list for the REVEAL Phase 3 clinical trial of ION582 at Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City, Missouri. This study aims to evaluate the efficacy and safety of an investigational treatment designed to address the underlying cause of Angelman Syndrome by increasing levels of the UBE3A protein.

Owen is being considered for the adult cohort (for ages 18-50), and we should learn in the coming months whether he meets the eligibility criteria and is admitted. We ask you to join us in praying for God's perfect will in this matter—that doors would open if it's His plan, and that we would have peace and wisdom throughout the process.

Missionary Acres Update

This year has been one focused on infrastructure improvements at Missionary Acres, and we're thrilled to report that this past month has advanced that goal in remarkable ways.

A team from First Baptist Church in Colville, Washington, traveled down to join us, bringing their skills and enthusiasm to tackle some pressing needs. They helped the staff replace aging culverts and upsize some of them which will help prevent our roads from washing out during the intense rains that are so common here in southeast Missouri. In addition, the team replaced two old metal septic tanks with modern cement ones and assisted with essential repairs to our sewer and water lines. Operating the rented equipment with impressive ease, this team accomplished an incredible amount in their time with us, and we're so grateful for their hard work and expertise.

We were also blessed by two wonderful volunteer families who pitched in to replace the aging roof of our machine shop and thoroughly clean out many of our storage spaces. Their efforts fill two large dumpsters with old scrap for
